OVERVIEW

The Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation recognizes distinguished clinicians and researchers for their significant contributions and advancements in the field of breast cancer survivorship. Chosen annually, two award recipients are presented a monetary award to further their work toward achieving the Komen mission: *to eradicate breast cancer as a life-threatening disease by advancing research, education, screening and treatment.*

The 2007 awards will be given in two categories, research and clinical, as described below. The Komen Foundation invites your nomination for the 2007 Professor of Survivorship Awards.

ELIGIBILITY

Nominees should demonstrate significant contributions to the field of breast cancer, particularly as they pertain to issues of survivorship.

Professor of Survivorship Research Award

Nominees for the Professor of Survivorship Research Award should demonstrate advancements through their research work, including, but not limited to community-based research, psycho-social research, basic or clinical research.

Professor of Survivorship Clinical Award

Nominees for the Professor of Survivorship Clinical Award should demonstrate contributions in the clinical realm, including, but not limited to, advancements in direct patient care and treatment, quality of life issues, and improvements for individual or community health.

Nominations are welcomed internationally. Self-nominations are not accepted.

NOMINATION PROCESS

Nominations will be accepted in a two-tiered online process, via proposalCENTRAL. Detailed application instructions can be found online at <https://v2.ramscompany.com>.

Late nominations will not be accepted. Nominations must be complete and in compliance with instructions to be eligible for committee review.

TIER 1

All eligible nominations will be considered in Tier 1 review.

TIER 2

Based on the decision of the review committee, three finalists will be selected in each category for Tier 2 review. If your candidate has been selected, the Foundation will contact you with a request for additional submissions.

Tier 1 Nominations should include:

- Summary of the nominee's specific contributions in the field of breast cancer survivorship, to include impact on the quality of life for survivors. *(2-page limit)*
- An abbreviated curriculum vitae or biosketch including a list of publications. *(3-page limit)*

DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSION OF TIER 1 IS NOVEMBER 30, 2006 AT 5:00 P.M. EST.

Tier 2 Nominations should include:

- Two letters of support from colleagues or peers of the nominee, describing how the nominee's work has advanced the field of breast cancer survivorship.
- Two letters of support from breast cancer survivors or survivor groups stating how the nominee's work has affected their lives.

DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSION OF TIER 2 IS FEBRUARY 14, 2007 AT 5:00 P.M. EST.

AWARD DETAILS

The recipients are honored at the annual Komen Mission Conference in June and presented with a hand-carved jade crystal award. A \$20,000 award will be made to the recipient's host institution to be used to further research and awareness on the issues surrounding long-term survivorship of breast cancer. Acceptance of the award signifies a good faith effort to use the funds responsibly within this parameter to advance the Komen Foundation's mission.

REVIEW PROCESS

The nominations for the Professor of Survivorship Awards will be reviewed in two tiers, by committees consisting of previous awardees and advocate reviewers. Reviewers nominating or referring a candidate in the current award cycle will be required to report conflicts of interest and will be ineligible to review in the conflicting award category.

The reviewers reserve the right to make no recommendations for the awards in a given year, if, in their judgment, no sufficiently distinguished recipients can be identified. Recommendations for the Professor of Survivorship Awards are subject to approval by the Komen Foundation's Executive Committee or Board of Directors.
