As senior vice president of mission for Susan G. Komen®, Victoria leads a team of scientists, public health professionals, educators, and administrators in developing and executing Komen's investment to fulfill our vision, working to end breast cancer in the U.S. and throughout the world through groundbreaking research, education, screening, and treatment programs in more than 30 countries. Victoria is responsible for Komen's scientific strategy and research programs, education and patient support programs, global programs and partnerships, public policy advocacy, and community health both nationally and throughout the Komen Affiliate Network. In this role, Victoria works closely with Komen's mission advisors, including the Scientific Advisory Board, Komen

Scholars, and Advocates in Science Steering Committee.

Victoria joined Susan G. Komen® in 2010 to establish Komen's research programs department staffed by breast cancer experts and provide in-house strategic leadership of a multi-million-dollar research investment. In 2013, she was appointed to the position of Managing Director, Grants and Program Administration and assumed oversight of Komen's community health programs, including grant-making operations for the Komen Affiliate Network, and global strategy and investments for partnerships in low- and middle-income countries. She became Vice President in 2015, assuming leadership of Komen's education and patient support programs, including the Komen Breast Care Helpline and partnership with Harvard University to produce educational content for komen.org. In 2018, Victoria was named Senior Vice President of all Mission programs of the Komen organization, assuming oversight of public policy and special initiatives, including Komen's Big Data for Breast Cancer program and Health Equity Initiatives.

She began her career in scientific grants and program management with the American Association for Cancer Research (AACR). Joining the AACR as one of the original staff of the newly established Program Administration department, she became Director of Program Administration with responsibility for a variety of scientific, educational, and global programming during her 11-year tenure. It was at AACR that her passion to conquer breast cancer began, when her friend and colleague, Glynis, was diagnosed with the disease.

Prior to AACR, Victoria was Director of Association Services for the Pennsylvania Trial Lawyers Association (now Pennsylvania Association for Justice), and a member of the legal support teams for several law firms in Philadelphia focused on patent law and civil litigation. A native of Philadelphia, Victoria is a graduate of Temple University, and now resides in Dallas, Texas.
